"PRINCIPAL'S CORNER"

- ▶ Mr. Bakker, Mr. Kamphuis and I recently returned from a three day conference in Edmonton where over 130 principals, vice-principals and other educational leaders withing the Christian Schools Canada organization were encouraged and challenged in our leadership roles. Our plenary speakers, Rev. Cecil Van Niejenhuis and Dr. Dan Reinhardt set the tone for the conference. Our personal stories, and the stories of our schools, are best understood in the context of God's big story; His faithfulness to his people is best understood when we consider how our schools fit "on the time line" between the book of Genesis and the book of Revelation. God, through Jesus Christ, is making all things new, and the Holy Spirit leads us as we faithfully follow God's leading. The workshops covered a range of topics, including learning to serve by serving, discovering one's strengths, curriculum leadership, professional boundaries, developing strategic plans, etc. It's great to be back at school today, and to have been reminded again of how Christian leaders around our country are influencing young people for service in God's Kingdom.
- ▶ Forgiveness continues to be our theme for the month of September as we strive to be part of the iCrew, God's Integrity Crew. For some children, the concept of forgiveness seems to be overwhelming. Why should I forgive so-and-so? S/he is so mean. May we all, old and young alike, be reminded of God's gift of forgiveness to each of us through his son Jesus Christ. May we truly strive to live as forgiven people who are eager to share God's forgiveness with our peers and family members. 
- ▶ This year's Student Council campaign is well underway. Posters are beginning to pop up in the hallways, and students are looking forward to hearing what the various candidates have to say. This year we will have an executive that is made up of president, vice-all and secretary. Speeches need to be submitted to Mrs. Van Beveren (staff representative) by Wednesday. Restorative Justice...is catching on as a progressive way for schools to address bullying, conflict and discipline issues. Through the past years the NACE staff has reviewed our anti-bullying policy and we have made some modifications to it based on restorative justice practises. RJ (restorative justice) is a Biblical way of restoring relationships and thereby nurturing a more harmonious learning environment. Rather than just punishing wrongdoers, now they have to face their victims, consider the impact of their actions and come up with ways to make amends. In August the NACE teachers met with a guest speaker as part of our professional development. We have booked the same individual, Mark VanderVennen of Shalem Christian Counselling Services, to speak to the NACE parent community this Thursday, September 30 in the Covenant library at 7:30 p.m. (6470 Reg. 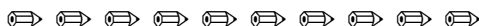
TPCE GOLF TOURNAMENT

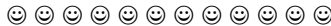
FUNDRAISING NEWS . . .
